HELD ON MAY 5TH, 1964

I, Wm. Billy Freeman, Supervisor of Registration of Electors of said County do hereby certify that the County Canvassing Board consisting of Helio Gomez, County Judge; Gerald Saunders, Chairman Board of County Commissioners and Wm. Billy Freeman, Supervisor of Registration of said County met in the office of the Supervisor of Registration on the 6th day of May, A. D. 1964 at 3:00 P.M. and ended on the 8th day of May, A. D. 1964 at 4:30 A.M. proceeded publicly to canvass the vote given for the offices and persons; together with the 986 absentee ballots as hereinafter specified at the First Primary Election held in said County on the 5th day of May, A. D. 1964 at which time all absentee ballots were challenged by Harry F. Knight, Junior Chamber of Commerce Chairman, James O. Tindell and Vice Chairman, John E. Baker also present was Paul E. Sawyer, County Attorney representing the Board of County Canvassers as shown by the returns on file in the office of said Judge and Supervisor of Registration, respectively. During the counting of these ballots several objections and challenges were made by the various persons present and rulings made by the Board, 244 absentee votes challenged were not counted and rejected as illegal, 742 were accepted and counted. The results counted by the Board to be true and good ballots were as follows: The total number of votes cast were Thirteen Thousand Three Hundred and Seventy-six (13,376); the total number of electors qualified were Eighteen Thousand One Hundred and Ninety (18,190).
