BILLY FREEMAN, Supervisor of Elections, and CURT BLAIR, Member of the Board of County Commissioners of said County, constituting the Board of County Canvassers in and for said County, do hereby certify that we met at the office of the Supervisor of Elections aforesaid, on the 12th day of March, A. D., 1980 and proceeded publicly to canvass the votes cast in the PRESIDENTIAL PREFERENCE PRIMARY AND SPECIAL ELECTIONS held in said County on the 11th day of March, A. D., 1980, as shown by the returns on file in the office of the Judge and Supervisor of Elections, respectively, and we do hereby certify from said returns as follows:

JIMMY CARTER received Five Thousand Two Hundred and Forty-Nine (5,249) Votes.

RICHARD B. KAY received One Hundred and Eighty (180) Votes.

EDWARD M. KENNEDY received One Thousand Seven Hundred and Sixty-Four (1,764) Votes.

NO PREFERENCE received Eight Hundred and Forty-Six (846) Votes.

The total number of votes cast in the REPUBLICAN Presidential Preference Primary was One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirteen (1,913) of which number:

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS, ARTICLE VII, SECTION 6

Proposing amendments to the State Constitution to provide a homestead exemption of \$25,000 from certain ad valorem school millage levies, providing authorization for ad valorem tax relief for permanent resident renters, and providing that the \$25,000 exemption from certain ad valorem school millage levies shall take effect upon approval by the voters and apply to the taxes levied on the assessment rolls for the year 1980 and each year thereafter.

AGAINST THE AMENDMENTS: 2,015 Votes
